One of our goals is to improve the sector of services, which is an area that has long been neglected. The next aim is to enhance public safety, which has been insufficient in the past years and therefore have had a negative impact on the entire country. In this regard, the Magistrate of Baghdad is fully aware of its responsibilities for the development and improvement in the area of services and public safety in the city of Baghdad.

Currently, the Baghdad Magistrate, being aware of the qualities, tradition and rich history of the ancient city, is pursuing all the goals that it has determined in the field of enhancing the quality of life in the city. With this target in mind, it is nowadays running multiple strategic projects and repairing works in order to achieve redevelopment and progress of the city.

To meet the targets, we are employing various international companies, especially in the area of building the infrastructure. These days it is very close to finishing a project in the integrated system of control, which includes laboratories for waste management and recycling. It is the biggest centre of its kind in the Near East and is run by the Afnan Turkish company with the aim of enhancing the environment situation in the capital city of Baghdad. It is mainly focused on recyclable waste and its appropriate use for organic fertilizers. The elimination of the remaining waste does not have an effect on the soil or the groundwater. The goal is to provide a complete protection of the environment with 9 plants in the general area of Baghdad and also to build 5 new plants, which will be constructed in the near future. Another goal we are thriving to achieve is to lower the pollution in rivers and other watercourses and the sources of water and to benefit from the cleaning in a way of using it for agricultural purposes. In this regard, the continuation and completion of two projects focusing on sustainable acquisition of clean water and preventing its pollution is crucial.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We would like to take this opportunity to warmly welcome new companies that are interested in contributing to the cultivation of the capital of Iraq and are considering the investment opportunities in our country.

There are many opportunities for investments and development in Iraq. Particularly, there is a room for making international contracts with Iraq regarding realization of projects in the area of industry and building new housing.
